Daily routines



Every day

Every day we have story time, rhyme time, phonics and a maths session.

However, the majority of our time is spent in play both indoors and outdoors. Our learning is designed to be done through practical, play based experiences. Play underpins our learning and all aspects of children's development. Through play, children develop language skills, their emotions and creativity, social and intellectual skills.

We go outdoors in most weathers. It is important that your child is sent to nursery in appropriate clothing for going outside, such as, a warm coat in Winter with a hat and gloves or a cap in hot sunny weather.





Foundation I pupils enter nursery via the Foundation Stage gate. Please wait near the gate with your child until 8.45 when a member of staff will come out to take the children into school. Any message or questions for the class teacher can be given to the member of staff on the gate and will be passed on for you. Teachers will get back to you through Class Dojo messages or at the end of the session.

At home time (11.45pm), the Foundation I staff will bring pupils out of the nursery door once the adult collecting them has been seen. Please wait for your child on the playground near the Foundation Stage gate. Please ensure you have completed the form on who can collect your child from nursery. If someone different will be collecting your child, please let the member of staff on the gate know when you drop your child off or contact the school office. Teachers are always available to discuss any issues or concerns at the end of the session once the children have been safely dismissed.

Punctuality and Attendance

Being on time and attending nursery every day are very important. Children have an increased sense of belonging and are more likely to feel settled and ready to learn if they are on time and in school every day.

Uniform

We are so proud of our school uniform. Please continue to support us with this. Pupils look smart, are comfortable and ready to learn. Please ensure all items are labelled so we can return lost and misplaced items to you. Permanent marker pens are available in the classroom if you would like items of clothing labelling.

Resources for school

Your child will need to bring their water bottle every day with fresh water inside. They will be encouraged to drink throughout the session and their bottle will be refilled if needed.

Your child will need their reading folder in school every day.

Some frequently asked questions...



How do I register my child for milk?

You will need to go to www.coolmilk.com and register. It is free for all children in Foundation 1.

Will my child get fruit?

All pupils in Foundation I get a piece of free fruit every day. You do not need to do anything to register for this.

How do I pay for trips, discos and film nights etc.?

You will need a sQuid account. Please see Mrs Dudley in the school office if you haven't set one up.

Will my child get a reading book?

Your child will get a library book every week for you to share with them. Please read this to them and encourage them to join in with the story where possible. It is important to share a book more than once with your child. You could talk about who is in the story and where the story is set.







Class Dojo

Teachers use Class Dojo to post pictures of learning happening in the classroom and to give reminders for events on their class pages. Class Dojo can also be used for parents to contact the class teacher and others in the Foundation I team. Please ensure that you have logged onto Class Dojo and turned on notifications to ensure that you are able to see all updates. Please be aware that teachers can not reply to Class Dojo messages during the session.
