Primary Schools Sports Funding 2017-18



What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing over £450 million on this funding for academic years 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sports funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)
- run sports activities with other schools

Our PE and Sports funding is received for each child.

Spending Amount	Description	Impact
£ 780	Membership of Ashfield School Sports Network and competition entries	Children are provided with the opportunity to take part in competitions and events with other schools To allow access to professional development opportunities for school staff.
£500	PE Resources	Children taking part in PE lessons and sports competitions are well resourced. There is an increase in children participating in sports competitions. Children are cooperating and working together as a team to represent their school.
£1755	Rugby Coaching Sessions	To enhance the quality of our provision for physical education. Children's levels of engagement, participation and confidence in this area are raised.
£1,000	Funding for transport	To enable children to travel to events and participate in festivals and tournaments.

Maths of the Day supports the physical literacy framework in that pupils learn physical, social and thinking skills through a range of activities.
£446.25	Annual subscription for IPEP PE Planner, Tracker and Assessment Tool	A consistent approach to the planning and teaching of PE across the whole school. Lessons are effective, progressive differentiated and well resourced.
£9,500	Employment of additional Primary Sports Coordinator	Pupils are developing their skills, participation, confidence and enjoyment in a range of sports. Teachers have the opportunity to develop their professional skills and knowledge of a range of sports.
