Draw Your Own Celtic Knots

Celtic patterns are an ancient artform which is popular for decoration and embellishment of religious writings and symbols. It is also rising in popularity with many non-religious groups.


The key feature is the use of one or more continuous ribbons or lines that interweave with themselves.

How to Draw a Celtic Knot

First, draw the pattern with a wide line. This can be done with a highlighter, paintbrush or wide felt tip. Let it dry before the next stage.

Next, use a thick black pen to draw the edges. Choose a starting point and take it in turns to go under and over another thick line as you meet it.

This pattern should help you.



Once you've gone over all the lines you should have something that looks like this.



Now you know how to draw them, why not design some of your own.



Design and Technology

Make a Geodesic Dome

A triangle is the strongest shape for building structures. A geodesic dome is a structure made from a number of triangles.






You will need:

- 65 sticks (length of your choice)
- Joiners (modelling clay, tape or similar)

Instructions

1. Use ten sticks to make a shape that has five triangles and doesn't lay flat once it is all joined together. See image 1.
2. Using ten more sticks, make five more triangles from each side of the shape you have made. See image 2.
3. Using 15 sticks, make two more triangles in-between each of these new triangles. Your dome should now have a second layer and look a bit bigger. See image 3.
4. With 20 more sticks, make a triangle from each outside edge of this new shape. See image 4.
5. Now, join the last set of triangles together with one additional stick. This should pull all the triangles together and finish your dome. See image 5.

Once you have made your dome, you could try adding a door, windows or a sheet over the top to protect you from the weather if you are inside.


